Setting up Mac for ArchiOffice/EngineerOffice 2015

This whitepaper provides instructions on how to prepare your Mac computer for ArchiOffice or EngineerOffice 2015. Due to changes in technology, which greatly improve the ArchiOffice or EngineerOffice experience, a few additional steps are required to allow you to continue using the same Mac machine you've been using for older versions of your program.

After you complete the following process, your Mac system will be ready to run ArchiOffice or EngineerOffice 2015.

Step 1: Creating a Virtual Windows Environment

ArchiOffice/EngineerOffice 2015 is a web-based program built using Microsoft .Net technology. While this technology enables your employees to access the program using either a Windows or Mac system, it must be installed on a server with a Windows operating system.

Fortunately you can set up a virtual Windows machine using either <u>VMWare</u> or <u>Parallels</u> virtualization software on your Mac. This virtual Windows OS will function as a web server, hosting the ArchiOffice or EngineerOffice web program and data for you.





If 5 or more users will be accessing ArchiOffice or EngineerOffice, we recommend using Parallels.

Step 2: Installing Windows

After you set up the virtual machine, you need to install Microsoft Windows. If 5 or less users will be using ArchiOffice or EngineerOffice, installing Windows 7 Pro or later is sufficient. You can use Windows Server 2008, 2008 R2 or 2012 with 6 or more ArchiOffice users.





Verify that your virtual software supports these Windows versions prior to installation.

After installing Windows, you need to make sure the Internet Information Services (IIS) and Microsoft .Net Framework are configured correctly. Then you are ready to install ArchiOffice on your virtual Windows machine (server).
